# 2025 DIVISION SCHOOLS PRESS CONFERENCE (PHASE 1)

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent Chief Education Supervisors All Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schoolheads All Others Concerned

- 1. In line with the thrusts to promote responsible and free journalism and pursuant to the provision of section 2 of RA 7079 or Campus Journalism Act of 1991, this Office through the Curriculum Implementation Division, announces the conduct of Division Schools Press Conference (Phase 1) on January 16-17, 2025 at Muñoz National High School-Main (JHS).
- 2. Anchored on the theme, "Empowering Voices: Nurturing Responsible Campus Journalism", this activity aims to:
  - a. hone learners journalistic skills;
  - demonstrate commitment in the advocacies of campus journalism and integrating them in related school community initiatives through various platforms;
  - c. enhance journalistic competence through healthy and friendly competitions;
  - d. promote responsible journalism and fair and ethical use of social media; and
  - e. provide a venue for an enriching learning experience for learners interested in pursuing journalism as a career; and
  - f. select participants who will represent the division to the 2025 Regional Schools Press Conference (RSPC).
- 3. The DSPC Phase 1 activities shall include the following:

- 4. Recognizing and respecting Intellectual Property Rights, the Department adheres to the rule concerning plagiarism. DepEd reiterates its stand to disqualify school papers found to have copied and published texts, graphics, and other materials without duly acknowledging their sources. The disqualification covers all competitions sections of the school paper.
- 5. To ensure a wider selection of strong Division contenders for the Regional Schools Press Conference (RSPC), a campus journalist both in elementary and secondary levels shall be allowed to participate in a maximum of two (2) contest categories.
- 6. The **Elimination Round (Phase 1)** will determine the **top 10 qualifiers for elementary** and **top five (5) for secondary** in individual categories advancing them to the Final Round. The **Final Round (Phase 2)** will decide the final rankings and select top three (3) winners in elementary and secondary in each individual category and medium and the champion teams in group categories during the Final Round or Phase 2 shall advance to the 2025 Regional Schools Press Conference.
- 7. Contestants in the Photojournalism may use any Digital Camera or DSLR with fixed lens. Each contestant is required to bring his or her own camera cable for uploading and saving of pictures. Caption sheets will be provided by the contest facilitators.
- 8. All schools must comply with No School Paper. No Contest Policy.
- 9. All contestants shall proceed directly to their respective contest venues upon arrival. Teacher-coaches can assist learners before, but not after they enter the contest rooms. For urgent needs or emergencies, coaches should coordinate with room proctors/facilitators.
- 10. Contest Facilitators are responsible for overseeing and supervising the categories assigned to them. They must be available at all times during the contest.
- 11. Official results of the individual events shall be announced through a Division Memorandum days after the elimination round. This is to ensure thorough evaluation of the outputs submitted by the contestants.
- 12. The Search for Most Outstanding School Paper Adviser and (MOSPA) and Most Outstanding Campus Journalists (MOCJ) at both elementary and secondary levels







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will also be conducted. Interested participants in these categories shall submit their documents after the **Final Round or Phase 2** to ensure the inclusion of their achievements in this phase. The deadline of submission is on **February 5, 2025**. Entries must be properly endorsed to the SDO Records Unit. The selection criteria for winner will follow the guidelines outlined in Regional Memorandum 182 s. 2024. Refer to Enclosure 3 for the details.

- 13.A School Publication Contest for elementary and secondary levels will also be held following the guidelines in DepEd Memorandum No. 25 s. 2024 or 2024 National Schools Press Conference. All public and private elementary and secondary schools are required to submit their publication. All entries, spanning from **August** to **December 2024**, must be submitted in PDF format via official One Drive. The deadline of submission is on **January 17**, **2025**. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 14. Schools are required to submit two (3) original copies of **Registration Form** duly endorsed by the school principal to the **SDO Records Unit** on or before **January 6**, **2025**.
- 15. A registration fee of P200.00 and membership fee of P30.00 for each participating campus journalist will be collected to help cover expenses, including contest materials, honoraria of evaluators/judges, meals, medals, and other related costs. The registration fees may be chargeable to school publication funds, school MOOE, and other local school funds in accordance with standard accounting and auditing rules and regulations. Meanwhile, participants from private schools are encouraged to coordinate with their respective schools to address their registration fees.
- 16. A membership fee of P60.00 will also be collected from each school paper adviser and coach. Treasurers of Division Association of Secondary School Paper Advisers and Division Association of Elementary School Paper Advisers shall facilitate the collection of membership fees.
- 17. School paper advisers shall ensure the payment of registration fees for their participants on or before **January 10**, **2025** at the **SDO Cash Unit**. Only participants with paid registration and membership fees are eligible for the elimination round.
- 18. It is emphasized that NO payment shall be made during the contest proper.
- 19. School paper advisers and coaches are responsible for the safety and security of their pupils and students during the entire duration of 2025 DSPC.
- 20. Select school paper advisers/coaches from public and private schools shall serve as contest/room facilitators. SPAs/coaches in elementary schools shall be assigned in the secondary level and vice versa.
- 21. Travel expenses arising from the participation of working committee chairs and cochairs from both school and division office in DSPC-related activities shall be







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covered by the respective school or division MOOE and other local fund sources subject to standard accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

- 22. Technical working group members who will serve on January 18, 2025 will earn service credits in accordance with DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2023 titled "Updated Guidelines on Granting Vacation Service Credits to Teachers."
- 23. This Memorandum shall serve as the official authority to travel of the participants involved in the DSPC and other related DSPC activities.


